Subject: Bond Defeasance

Action Required: Yes

We sent our 2022 Certified Values to SAMCO Capital Markets, our financial advisors, to look at the tax rate impact of issuing additional debt in the event Trustees approve a bond election this evening.

Due to an increase in property values, the Maintenance and Operations Rate will be compressed by seven cents. This presents a unique opportunity to defease certain bonds, saving taxpayers approximately \$500,000 in interest while still decreasing the total tax rate by four cents.

The Tax Rate Impact Analysis prepared by SAMCO Capital Markets is included for your consideration. SAMCO will not be at the meeting to answer questions, but Matt Lee with Norton Rose Fulbright, our Bond Counsel, will be at the meeting to address any legal questions regarding the potential defeasance.

The Finance Committee met on August 27, 2022, to discuss the potential bond defeasance and recommends the third option. Based on this information, the Tax Rate Notice that will be published in the Galveston Daily News prior to this meeting includes the defeasance of bonds and a total tax rate of \$1.3113, four cents less than this year. This would be the highest rate that the District could assess without publishing a new notice. However, the District could adopt a tax rate that is lower than the published rate without distributing a new notice.

Recommendation: Administration, with support from the Finance Committee recommends that Trustees approve a Resolution providing for the defeasance and calling for redemption of certain currently outstanding obligations as outlined in the TRIA Option 3, resulting in a debt service tax rate of \$0.3684 and total tax rate of \$1.3113.

Subject: Delegation of Authority to Obligate the School District Under Chapter 49

Action Required: Yes

Each year the Board must delegate the authority to obligate the District under chapter 49 to the Superintendent. The following language is required to be recorded in the board minutes and the board minutes must be uploaded via the Excess Local Revenue system of the online FSP System. The contract will not be approved via the Excess Local Revenue module without the board minutes delegating the authority to the Superintendent.

Motion and Board Minute Language: For the 2022-2023 school year, we delegate contractual authority to obligate the school district under Texas Education Code (TEC)11.1511(c)(4) to the Superintendent solely for the purpose of obligating the District under TEC 48.257 and TEC Chapter 49, Subchapters A and D, and the rules adopted by the commission of education as authorized under TEC 49.006. This includes approval of the Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credit.

Subject: Board Designation of Employee to Calculate the District's No-New-Revenue Tax Rate and Voter-

Approval Tax Rate

Action Required: Yes

According to TASB's Publication *School District Budget and Tax Rate Adoption 2022*, an officer or employee designated by the board calculates the District's no-new-revenue tax rate and voter-approval tax rate (VATR) using tax rate calculation forms prescribed by the comptroller. If the assessor receives a certified estimate, the designated district officer or employee calculates the required rates using the certified estimate. The designated officer or employee must also electronically incorporate specific information regarding the district tax rates and the public hearing on the tax rate into the property tax database maintained by the chief appraiser.

The Assistant Superintendent for Business and Operations works closely with the District's Tax Assessor/Collector to enter all required data into the TNT software to calculate the required rates and create the notice that is published in the newspaper for the public hearing. However, the Tax Assessor/Collector enters the certified property values into the TNT software. As a result, I recommend that the Board of Trustees designate Vera Robinson, Tax Assessor/Collector, to calculate the District's no-new-revenue tax rate and voter-approval tax rate (VATR) using tax rate calculation forms prescribed by the comptroller.

Subject: Proposed Budget

Action Required: No

Included for your review and consideration is the 2022-2023 Proposed Operating Budget. The reports presented are generated from Skyward, but I will present a Power Point using this information, discuss the budget, and answer any questions to prepare Trustees for the Public Hearing that will be held on August 16, 2022.

The Proposed Budget would be funded with a Maintenance and Operation Tax Rate of \$0.9601 and a Debt Service Tax Rate of \$0.3684 (assuming bond defeasance), resulting in a Total Tax Rate of \$1.3113, a decrease of four cents when compared to the current tax rate.

The Proposed Budget honors the three goals established in March:

- 1. Present Trustees with a Balanced Budget
 - a. The Proposed Budget is balanced
 - i. Formula Transition Grant is considered temporary funding and is not used to balance the District's base budget. However, Formula Transition Grant may be assigned through budget amendments over the course of the year to address one-time expenditures and needs of the District.
 - ii. ESSER funds are used to fund positions, but personnel are aware that the position is funded with a temporary funding source and may be dissolved if funding is no longer available. These positions are considered supplementary to the base budget.
- 2. Provide Staff with a Meaningful Salary Increase
 - a. The Proposed Budget includes a 3% increase based on the TASB model approved at the June Board Meeting.

- 3. Increase the District's Contribution to Health Insurance
 - a. The Proposed Budget includes a contribution of \$300 per employee per month for health insurance.

The Texas City ISD will hold a public meeting at 06:30 PM, August 16, 2022 in Simpson Education Support Center, 1700 9th Avenue N., Texas City, TX 77590. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the school district's budget that will determine the tax rate that will be adopted. Public participation in the discussion is invited.

The tax rate that is ultimately adopted at this meeting or at a separate meeting at a later date may not exceed the proposed rate shown below unless the district publishes a revised notice containing the same information and comparisons set out below and holds another public meeting to discuss the revised notice.

Maintenance Tax \$0.9429/\$100 (proposed rate for maintenance and operations)
School Debt Service Tax \$0.3684/\$100 (proposed rate to pay bonded indebtedness)

Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in tax rate or property value.

Notice of Voter-Approval Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.3113. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the voter-approval rate of \$1.3113.

Fund Balances

The following estimated balances will remain at the end of the current fiscal year and are not encumbered with or by a corresponding debt obligation, less estimated funds necessary for operating the district before receipt of the first state aid payment.

A school district may not increase the district's maintenance and operations tax rate to create a surplus in maintenance and operations tax revenue for the purpose of paying the district's debt service.

Subject: Consider Approval of Increase of Bus Driver Pay for 2022-2023

Action Required: Yes

Bus drivers are in a critical shortage at this time. After a review of surrounding districts' bus driver pay, TCISD is behind on average starting pay of its peer districts. We are proposing an increase of \$2.15 per hour for all District bus drivers with the starting pay increasing from \$19.35 per hour to \$21.50 per hour effective on August 17, 2022. With the proposed new compensation plan for bus drivers, TCISD will become highly competitive and aggressive in the recruitment and retention of quality bus drivers for our students.

I recommend that Trustees approve the 2022-2023 increase in bus driver pay as presented.
