MITIGATION

Recommended and required practices to reduce the likely spread inside the school

The Task Force met after the first 6 weeks of face-to-face instruction to review procedures in the Reopening Plan. The following recommendations were made to try for a 3-week period beginning Nov. 2, 2020.

RECESS FOR ELEMENTARY STUDENTS

- Students can go outside for recess and/or outdoor structured activities.
- Outdoor play such as hopscotch, jumping, skipping, running and walking will be encouraged.
- No playground equipment will be used.
- Proper hand washing will take place after recess.

CLASSROOM CHANGES AT LA MARQUE MIDDLE SCHOOL

LMMS opted to begin face-to-face instruction by having teachers rotate to the classrooms except for electives. Beginning Nov. 2, all students will be allowed to switch classrooms throughout the day like the other district middle and high schools. Proper procedures will be in place and clear expectations for students and staff will be communicated at the campus level.

NUTRITION SERVICES - LUNCH PICK-UP

In order to be able to provide more options for hot food items, students will begin rotating to the cafeteria to pick up lunches in the cafeteria and return to the classrooms to eat. In order to keep class sizes down, schools have been utilizing every space possible for classrooms. Therefore, the following exceptions exist:

- Students at Levi Fry Intermediate will still have lunches delivered to their classroom at this time since the cafeteria is used for classroom space. Hundreds of students going through the cafeteria during the lunch periods would be too disruptive to those classes.
- Students at Simms Elementary use the cafeteria for classroom space. However, the Hayley Elementary cafeteria can serve students from both schools. Because of the large numbers combining these schools, a trial period of only students in grades 3, 4 and 5 will go through the cafeteria to pick up lunch for this 3-week period. Grades K-2 will continue to have lunch delivered to their classroom at this time. More grades will be added if the cafeteria can accommodate them in a timely manner.

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VIRTUAL STUDENTS ON CAMPUS FOR ATHLETICS & FINE ARTS

High school students enrolled in any UIL athletic period or designated fine arts classes now have the option to attend their athletic and/or fine arts class in person. The designated fine arts classes are as follows: band, jazz ensemble, mariachi, varsity mixed choir, varsity girls choir, Soundsations, dance teams, theatre (UIL one act play).

- Virtual students will follow all District required health and safety protocols when they are attending face-to-face.
- Virtual students must report to their high school and be in their face-to-face class within 10 minutes of the bell ringing for class to start.
- Virtual students can only attend their designated athletic or fine arts class during the instructional day. They cannot go to any other parts of the school. They must leave the school immediately upon completion of the class they came to school to attend.
- Virtual students must enter and exit through their designated door only. Students will receive specific door locations from their coaches or teachers.
- It is not mandatory for virtual students to attend face-to-face athletics or fine arts courses during the instructional day.
